The Economic and Social Council, also known as ECOSOC, is one of the United Nations 6 main bodies. It is known for addressing international issues linked to both economic aspects such as sustainable development, global trade, employment, and economic inequality. The Economic and Social Council. ECOSOC works with 54 member countries elected by the UN General Assembly for 3-year terms, also working with over 3,200 nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), and many UN agencies like UNESCO, WHO, and UNICEF. The topics chosen in ECOSOC balance economic aspects like financial growth, with social aspects like good healthcare, proper educational systems, suitable infrastructure, and more.

ECOSOC is the only committee which is allowed to discuss funding and financial support for global projects. It coordinates how resources are allocated to important development projects, humanitarian aid, and UN agencies. For example, ECOSOC reviews funding for programs that fight poverty, improve education, support refugees, and promote sustainable development.

ECOSOC embodies this year's AMMUN theme "Deliberate to Liberate", by bringing international entities like countries and NGOs together, to discuss and plan solutions that free people from poverty, inequality, and social challenges. Through careful deliberation, it creates policies and coordinates funding that empower communities and promote sustainable development worldwide. The theme 'Deliberate to Liberate' connects to my chosen topics because each issue requires careful discussion and decision-making to improve lives.

Being a THIMUN affiliated conference, delegates have lots of responsibilities and high expectations in terms of debate, and in terms of respect. Delegates are expected to use the AMMUN conference as a platform to discuss ideas and come up with effective and realistic solutions.
